Students of GSSS South Point Visit ICAR-CIARI for Field Exposure

A group of 145 students from Govt. Sr. Secondary School, South Point, Sri Vijaya Puram, accompanied by eight teachers, undertook a field exposure visit to the Garacharma Research Complex of ICAR-Central Island Agricultural Research Institute (CIARI) today. The visit aimed to provide students with practical insights into recent advancements in agriculture, fisheries, and allied sectors.

During the visit, Mr. Chittaranjan Raul, Scientist, introduced the students to the Freshwater Ornamental Fish Culture Unit, which houses breeding and rearing facilities for aquarium fishes such as guppy and molly. He also explained how ICAR-CIARI provides comprehensive production packages to support the farming community of the Islands.

Dr. Prabhu P., Scientist, highlighted the development of salt-tolerant rice varieties and explained methods for assessing their disease resistance.
